Lesson Title: Jannah and Jahannam - Jahannam	
Learning Objectives	Lesson Outcomes
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To know the Arabic word for Hell: Jahannam. To be able to give a brief description of Hell. To learn that if they do something wrong, they need to ask Allah for forgiveness. To learn what to avoid in relation to being safe from Hell. To have a non-judgmental attitude to others as we do not know whom Allah will guide later on in life. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All: Be able to give a brief description of Jahannam. All: Learn about seeking forgiveness from sins Most: Know the Arabic word for Hell. Some: Know what actions to avoid in relation to Jahannam.
Activity 1: Memorisation (20 minutes) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Revision of previous duas, using actions to help recall. Introduction of new dua: Sneezing (Alhamdulillah). Ask students: What do we say when we sneeze? Use action of sneezing followed by Alhamdulillah. 	
Activity 2: Arabic (15 minutes) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Recap Alif, Bā and Tā. Introduce Thā is for thawāb – to get good rewards. Draw the letter Thā on the board and repeat in a choral drill. Explain that Allah gives the best rewards. Give example of parents giving them toys when they are well behaved but Allah will give rewards 10000x better. Get the students to colour in Thā in the workbook. 	
Break: Remind students what to say before eating.	
Activity 3: Introduction to Jahannam (20 minutes) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teacher elicits information from students on the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> What is Hell? A place where bad people go when they die. What do we call Hell in Arabic? Jahannam. Explain the concept of Jahannam – It is a place where bad people will get sent to if Allah is upset with them on the Day of Judgement. If their book of deeds is placed in their left hand, they go to Jahannam. Be sensitive and explain that Allah is Ar-Rahmān: the most merciful and so he can forgive those who have committed lots of sin. Explain the importance of repentance and seeking Allah’s forgiveness when we do something wrong. Explain how we should be careful in our actions to prevent committing sin e.g think before we speak to avoid hurting people. Role Play: Children will be put into groups and asked to act out a bad action and what to do to solve the situation e.g hitting your friend, solving it by apologising and asking Allah to forgive them. 	

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Activity 4: Workbook Activity (25 minutes)

- Children colour in and cut out the words to stick around the Jahannam circle.
- They draw pictures inside the circle of what they want to avoid in Jahannam.

Activity 5: Writing Arabic (45 minutes)

- Recap Alif, Bā and Tā, along with potential mistakes they can make. Draw it with the mistakes on the boards and make them correct it.
- Introduce Thā: down, side, up with three dots in the middle. Make students repeat this in a choral drill.
- Ask students to draw Thā in the air, some students can volunteer to draw it on the board. Must repeat how to draw it (down, side, up etc.) as they are drawing on the board. The class will repeat it with them.
- **Students will draw all four letters on a piece of paper. Ensure they take no shortcuts when drawing the letters e.g leaving the dots until last.**

Plenary: (10 minutes)

- Ask students what the Arabic term for Jahannam is.
- Ask students what we should do to avoid Jahannam.
